Your 2023 Final tax bill is payable in two installments; June 27, 2023 and September 26, 2023

PLEASE RETAIN THE FINAL TAX BILL ENCLOSED FOR INCOME TAX PURPOSES.

Taxes for new homes/improvements

Your property may not be fully assessed if you have built or made improvements to your property. A separate supplementary tax bill will be issued for taxes related to this construction only, which will be retroactive to the date of purchase or completion.

PAYING YOUR TAXES

At Your Bank – In Person/Telephone/Internet

- You can set up your payment through your financial institution. – Payee: Alnwick/Haldimand Tax
- Your 19-digit roll number is your account number. Each property owned must be set up as a separate payee account with the corresponding roll number.

By Mail

- Cheques payable to Township of Alnwick Haldimand. Please include your roll number on the front of the cheque.
- Post-dated cheques are accepted.

In Person

- You may pay by debit, cheque or cash at the Grafton Administration Office, Monday to Friday 9 am-4:30 pm.
- After hours payments can be deposited in our secure drop box (front door). Please DO NOT deposit cash in the drop box.

PLEASE NOTE: Your payment is recorded the date it is received not the date it is mailed or paid online. Online banking payments may take up 72 hours to be received and recorded by the municipality. Penalty will be charged on all late payments.

Late Payments/Returned Payments

Payments that are not received will be charged at the rate of 1.25% interest on the outstanding balance on the **first day of each month**

Penalty charges cannot be cancelled by staff or Council.

Payments returned are subject to a \$60.00 service charges.

How your taxes are calculated

Assessment x Tax Rate = Total Taxes

For example, if your house is assessed at \$300,000, your tax bill would be:

$$\text{\$300,000} \times .01263893 = \text{\$3,791.68}$$

Schedule 2 & 3 – Explanation of Tax Changes

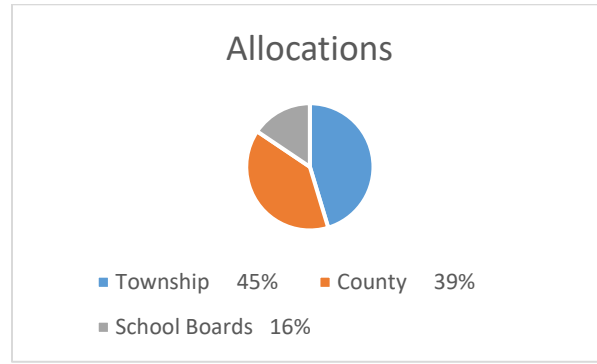

The Township received approval for the following grants:

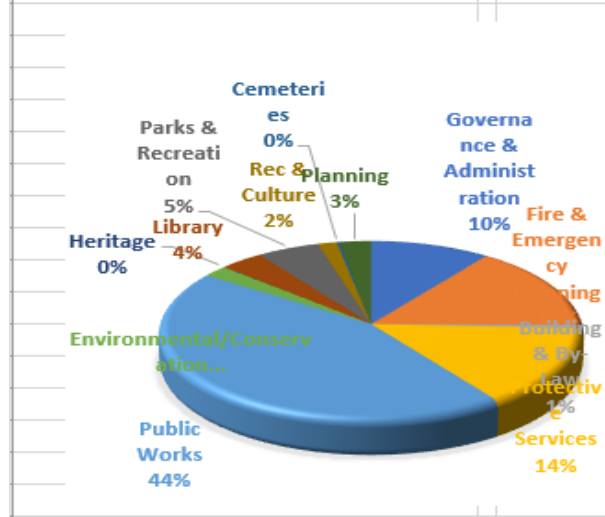
- OCIF- Resilient Communities Fund - \$98,500 (projects started in 2022, completed in 2023)

Burning Permits

The Council of the Municipality advises everyone in the Municipality of By-Law #139-2021 for Open Air Fires.

All persons setting an Open-Air Fire in the Municipality must first obtain a Permit from the Fire Department.

Any person who is planning a controlled fire is advised to visit the township website at www.alnwickhaldimand.ca to purchase their annual burn permit or by visiting the Fire Administration office at 9160 County Road 45, Roseneath or phone 905-352-1142.

Fire Works

All persons setting off fireworks in the Municipality must first obtain a Permit from the Fire Department.

9-1-1 Address & Fire Hydrants

Please ensure your 911 Civic Address number and fire hydrants are visibly clear of snow / brush / weeds / grass for quick response of emergency vehicles. Have your 911 address available beside your telephone in case of an emergency.

Message from Your Fire Prevention Team

It's the Law!! You must have a smoke alarm on each floor of your home. Check your smoke alarm monthly and change batteries twice per year. After ten years replace your smoke alarms.

Emergency Planning

You and your household would need to be safe and take care of yourselves for **at least three days** immediately following an emergency.

The following list is broken down into the essentials, items you may need to meet your household's unique needs, and items to have ready in case you have to leave your home.

Essentials

- food (non-perishable and easy-to-prepare items, enough for three days) and a manual can opener
- bottled water (4 litres per person for each day)
- medication(s)
- flashlight and glow stick
- radio (crank or battery-run)
- extra batteries
- first-aid kit
- candles and matches/lighter
- hand sanitizer or moist towelettes
- important papers (identification, contact lists, copies of prescriptions, etc.)
- extra car keys and cash
- whistle (to attract attention, if needed)
- zip-lock bag (to keep things dry)
- garbage bags
- personal items (soap, toothpaste, shampoo, comb, other toiletries)
- playing cards, travel games and other activities for children
