

The Corporation of the Township of Alnwick/Haldimand

By-law No. 60-2022

**Being a By-Law to Regulate the Sale and Setting Off of Fireworks
Within the Township of Alnwick/Haldimand and to Establish and Set
Fees/Charges Thereof**

Whereas Council acknowledges that fireworks have the potential to pollute air and water, negatively impact wildlife in the vicinity and diminish quality of life for some residents;

And Whereas Council wishes to take action to mitigate the risk to human, animal and environmental health;

And Whereas Section 121 (a) of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c.25 provides that the Council may prohibit and regulate the sale of fireworks and the setting off of fireworks;

And Whereas Section 434.1 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c. 25 as amended, enables the councils of local municipalities to establish a system of administrative penalties;

And Whereas Section 434.2 establishes an administrative penalty constitutes a debt of the person which may be added to the tax roll;

And Whereas pursuant to Section 436 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended, a municipality has the power to pass by-laws providing that the municipality may enter on land at any reasonable time for the purpose of carrying out an inspection to determine whether a by-law of the municipality passed under the Act is being complied with;

Now Therefore Be it Resolved that the Council of the Corporation of The Township of Alnwick/Haldimand ENACTS the Following:

1.0 Definitions

In this By-law the following words have the meaning assigned thereto:

- 1.1 **"Act"** means the Explosives Act, Revised Statutes of Canada, 1985, Chapter E-17, and the Regulations enacted thereunder as amended from time to time or any Act and Regulations enacted in substitutions therefore;
- 1.2 **"Application Package"** means a document that is prepared and available on the township website and/or at the Fire Department office.
- 1.3 **"Building"** means any structure used or intended to be used for supporting or sheltering any use or occupancy;
- 1.4 **"By-Law Enforcement Officer"** means a Person who is appointed by Council to enforce bylaws enacted and passed by Council;
- 1.5 **"Chief Fire Official"** as defined in the Ontario Fire Code O. Reg. 213/07, Article 1.4.1.2.;
- 1.6 **"Council"** means the Council of The Corporation of the Township of Alnwick/Haldimand;
- 1.7 **"Discharge"**, when used in relation to Fireworks, Prohibited Fireworks and

Firecrackers, includes firing, igniting, exploding and setting-off such articles;

- 1.8 **"Display Fireworks"** means outdoor, high hazard fireworks for recreation, that is designed for professional, licenced use only. They include firecrackers, that are classified under Class 7, Division 2, Subdivision 2 under the *Explosives Act* and the regulations made thereunder and includes, but is not limited to, rockets, serpents, aerial shells, cakes, roman candles, lances, bombshells, tourbillion, maroon, large wheels, bouquets, barrages, bombardons, waterfalls, fountains, batteries, illuminations, set pieces and pigeons;
- 1.9 **"Explosives Act"** means the *Explosives Act*, R.S.C. 1985, c.E-17, and the regulations therein;
- 1.10 **"Family Fireworks"** means outdoor, low-hazard Fireworks that are designed for recreational personal use and are classified under Class 7, Division 2, Subdivision 1 of the *Explosives Act* and the Regulations made therein;
- 1.11 **"Firecracker"** means a pyrotechnic device that explodes when ignited and does not make any subsequent display or visible effect after the explosion but does not include paper caps containing not more than twenty-five one-hundredths of a grain of explosive on average per cap, devices for use with such caps, safety flare or marine rockets;
- 1.12 **"Fireworks"** as defined in the Explosive Regulations made pursuant to the Explosives Act, R.S. c. E-15, s.1 as amended and includes one single item of Fireworks; Means Display Fireworks, Family Fireworks and Theatrical Fireworks;
- 1.13 **"Fireworks Supervisor"** means a person certified as a technician under the *Explosives Act* to conduct displays of Fireworks;
- 1.14 **"Licensing Officer"** means a person appointed by the Township to issue permits;
- 1.15 **"Magazine"** means magazine as defined in the *Explosives Act*;
- 1.16 **"Mobile Sales Premise"** means a mobile or portable premise from which Fireworks are sold and includes a trailer, roadside stand and a motor vehicle;
- 1.17 **"Owner"** means the registered owner of the land as shown on the most recent tax assessment roll and includes the authorized agent of the owner, a lessee or any person authorized by the owner to be in charge of the lands;
- 1.18 **"Permanent Fireworks Premise"** means a premise located within a building or part thereof in which the principal year-round business is the sale of Fireworks;
- 1.19 **"Permit"** means an authorization under the By-law to sell Fireworks from a business premises or a Mobile Sales Premise or to discharge fireworks, issued by the Municipality pursuant to this By-law and signed by the Chief Fire Official or their designate;
- 1.20 **"Person"** means any human being, association, firm, partnership, incorporated company, corporation, agent or trustee, and the heirs, executors or other legal representatives of a Person to whom the context can apply, according to law;
- 1.21 **"Premises"** means land and includes the buildings and/or structures thereon;
- 1.22 **"Prohibited Fireworks"** includes, but is not limited to, cigarette loads or pings, exploding matches, sparking matches, ammunition for miniature tie clip, cufflink, or key chain pistols auto alarms or jokers, cherry bombs, M-80 and

silver salutes and flash crackers; throw down and step on torpedoes, and crackling balls; exploding golf balls, stink bombs and smoke bombs, tear gas pens and launchers, party peppers and table bombs, table rockets and battle sky rockets, fake Firecrackers and other trick devices or practical jokes, as included on the most recent list of prohibited Fireworks, as published from time to time under the *Explosives Act*;

- 1.23 **"Public Fireworks Display"** means an exhibition of Fireworks in an open-air assembly, occupancy to which the public is invited, attends or is admitted, with or without a fee being charged;
- 1.24 **"Pyrotechnics"** are high-hazard and designed for professional use. They include but is not limited to items like gerbs, mines, comets, and crossette fireworks, as well as special-purpose pyrotechnics made for live stage performances and the film and television industry;
- 1.25 **"Temporary Fireworks Premise"** means a premise within a building or part thereof where a retailer only sells Family Fireworks on Victoria Day, on Canada Day or the 7 -day period before Victoria Day and Canada Day but whose principal business is not the sale of Fireworks;
- 1.26 **"Temporary Lease Fireworks Premise"** means a premise where a retailer leases a Building or part thereof on a temporary basis solely for the purpose of selling Family Fireworks on Victoria Day, on Canada Day or the 7 -day period before Canada Day and Victoria Day;
- 1.27 **"Theatrical Fireworks"** means an authorized explosive of a class set out in Section 6 of the *Explosives Act*, that is made, manufactured or used to produce a pyrotechnic theatrical effect in connection with a motion picture, theatre or television production, or as a performance, before a live audience;
- 1.28 **"Township"** means the Corporation of The Township of Alnwick/Haldimand;
- 1.29 **"Setting Off"** or **"Set Off"** means to fire, discharge, ignite, explode or release into the air or to cause to fire, discharge, ignite or explode or release into the air;
- 1.30 **"Sell"** includes offering for sale, causing or permitting to be sold and possessing for the purpose of sale;
- 1.31 **"Weekend"** means the period from Friday evening through Sunday evening; and **"Long Weekend"** means the period from Friday evening through Monday evening.

2.0 General Prohibitions

- 2.1 No person shall possess or discharge Fireworks except in accordance with the provisions of this By-law.
- 2.2 No person shall possess or discharge any Firecrackers or other Prohibited Fireworks.
- 2.3 No person shall sell any Fireworks except in accordance with the provisions of this By-law.
- 2.4 No Person shall cause, permit or engage in the Setting Off of Family Fireworks in the Township of Alnwick/Haldimand at any time, except as permitted under Section 3 of this By-law.
- 2.5 No person may discharge or possess for the purpose of discharge any Family

Fireworks, Display Fireworks or Theatrical Fireworks except pursuant to a Permit.

- 2.6 In circumstances where a Permit is obtained for the discharge of Fireworks, no permit applicant shall discharge Fireworks at a date, time, location or site other than that specified in the Permit and all conditions of such Permit shall be observed.
- 2.7 No person shall discharge Fireworks in a manner that creates or may create a nuisance or that creates or may create an unsafe condition, danger from fire or from risk of accident, injury or damage at or in respect of any place, location or site, or to or in respect of any person, property or thing.
- 2.8 No person shall discharge Fireworks into, in or on any highway, street, lane, square, school yard, public park or another public place, without previously obtaining a Permit for such purpose.
- 2.9 No person shall store Fireworks unless such storage is in compliance with the *Explosives Act*, R.S.C. 1985, c.E-17, and the regulations thereto.

3.0 Regulations Affecting the Discharge of Family Fireworks

- 3.1 No parent or guardian of any person under the age of eighteen years shall allow or permit that person to discharge Family Fireworks, except under the direct supervision and control of a person eighteen years of age or older, who shall, at all times, remain physically present in the immediate area where the Family Fireworks are being discharged.
- 3.2 No person shall discharge or hold a display of Family Fireworks on any land that is not owned by him or her, unless written permission for the discharging or the holding of a display of Family Fireworks, on a date to be clearly specified in the written permission, has been obtained from the owner.
- 3.3 Every person who discharges Family Fireworks shall:
- a) provide and maintain fully operational fire extinguishing equipment ready for immediate use;
 - b) ensure that such fire extinguishing equipment is present at all times and for a reasonable period of time thereafter, at the location or site where the discharge of Family Fireworks is to take place;
 - c) possess knowledge of the operating procedures of such fire extinguishing equipment and be capable of employing such fire extinguishing equipment;
 - d) permit the inspection of any location or site where the Family Fireworks may be stored, discharged or displayed, and of the Family Fireworks themselves, together with all associated equipment, by anyone authorized to enforce this By-law, forthwith upon demand;
 - e) ensure that all fireworks are discarded in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions;
 - f) comply with minimum distance requirements as outlined on the fireworks.
- 3.4 No person shall discharge Family Fireworks into, inside of, or on a building, accessory building, structure, or motor vehicle.

4.0 Permits for the Discharge of Family Fireworks, Display Fireworks or Theatrical Fireworks

- 4.1 A permit application shall be completed for the discharging of Family Fireworks, Display Fireworks or Theatrical Fireworks in accordance with Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming part of this by-law.
- 4.2 Only Persons who hold a valid Display Supervisor certificate, issued by the Explosives Regulatory Division (ERD) of Natural Resources Canada are eligible to apply for a permit to Set Off "Display Fireworks" or "Pyrotechnic" Special Effects.
- 4.3 An application package as prescribed under this by-law must be submitted to the Chief Fire Official or their designate a minimum of 45 days prior to the date being applied for.
- 4.4 No permit shall be issued to any person under eighteen years of age.
- 4.5 Every permit application shall include:
- a) a description of the type and kind of Fireworks which may be discharged, the discharge techniques to be used, the manner and means of restraining unauthorized persons from attending too near the discharge location, the manner in which unused Fireworks are to be disposed of and the number of persons authorized to handle and discharge the Fireworks;
 - b) a description of the discharge site to be used for the discharging of the Fireworks sufficient to identify and locate the site upon the property where the discharge is proposed;
 - c) proof from the owner of the land that authorization has been granted to use those lands for the discharge of Fireworks;
 - d) the name of the applicant and the name of the sponsoring organization, if applicable;
 - e) the date and time of the proposed discharge of Fireworks and an alternate date and time in the event of inclement weather;
- 4.6 Every application for a Permit for **Display Fireworks** or **Theatrical Fireworks** shall include:
- a) proof of commercial general liability insurance in an amount not less than Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.), naming The Township as an additional insured and containing a cross liability clause;
 - b) proof that the applicant has been approved by the Chief Inspector of Explosives pursuant to the *Explosives Act* as a Fireworks Supervisor by providing a copy of Fireworks Supervisor's Permit;
 - c) an Indemnification and Hold Harmless Undertaking in favour of the Township and signed by the applicant or by an individual having the authority to bind the applicant;
- 4.7 Every person to whom a Permit is issued shall:
- a) provide and maintain fully operational fire extinguishing equipment ready for immediate use, and shall be present at all times and for a reasonable period thereafter, at the location or site of the discharge of Fireworks;

b) possess knowledge of the operating procedures of such fire extinguishing equipment and be capable of employing such fire extinguishing equipment;

c) conform to the provisions of the current issue of the Fireworks Manual as published from time to time by the Explosives Branch of Natural Resources Canada, or any successor publication, applicable to the discharge of Fireworks authorized in the Permit;

d) produce the Permit on demand by any person authorized to enforce this By-law; and

e) permit the inspection of the Fireworks and any site where the Fireworks may be stored or discharged together with all associated equipment.

4.8 Every Permit issued shall include the following conditions:

a) that the Permit holder shall only discharge the Fireworks at the date(s), time(s), location and discharge site shown on the Permit;

b) that no person, except a Fireworks Supervisor, shall discharge any Display or Theatrical Fireworks;

c) that the Fireworks Supervisor, who is named on the Permit application, shall be present in person at the display at all times during which the display is being set up, discharged and cleaned up;

d) that no person shall discharge Display or Theatrical Fireworks within three hundred (300) metres of any premises or place where explosives, gasoline or other highly flammable substances are manufactured or stored in bulk; and

e) that no person shall discharge Display or Theatrical Fireworks within three hundred (300) metres of a hospital, nursing home, home for the aged, church or school unless the owner of such premises has provided consent in writing. Fireworks are not permitted to be displayed in high population density areas.

4.9 The Chief Fire Official or designate of the Alnwick Haldimand Fire Department may, at his/her discretion, attach additional conditions to the Permit upon issuance of the permit.

4.10 The application package shall contain the requirements as found in the Natural Resources Canada (NRCAN) Fireworks Display Manual:

4.11 The Permit may be suspended or revoked by the Chief Fire Official or their designate if the conditions of the permit are not being met or it would be unsafe to allow the public Fireworks Display.

4.12 The Display Fireworks shall only be Set Off on the day or days specified by the Permit.

4.13 Property damage or injury as a result of Display Fireworks shall be the responsibility of the Person named on the permit.

5.0 Regulations Affecting the Sale of all Fireworks

5.1 All vendors of Fireworks in the Township are required to conduct the sales of

Fireworks within a Permanent Fireworks Premise, Temporary Fireworks Premise or Temporary Lease Fireworks Premise, and in accordance with this By-law and all applicable law.

- 5.2 Notwithstanding 5.1, a Mobile Sales Premises may be approved within the Township provided the vendor conforms to Section 7 of this By-law.
- 5.3 No person shall sell Fireworks unless:
- a) the Fireworks are included on the most recent list of authorized explosives as published from time to time by the Explosives Branch of Natural Resources Canada, or their successors;
 - b) the Fireworks are sold in accordance with the standards of Natural Resources Canada;
 - c) the Fireworks are displayed for sale in a package, glass case or other suitable receptacle away from flammable goods; and
 - d) the Fireworks are displayed in a place where they are not exposed to the rays of the sun or to excess heat or adjacent to any exit door.
- 5.4 All vendors of Fireworks in the Township must display and make available to purchasers of Fireworks, a manufacturer's brochure outlining the safe handling of Fireworks.
- 5.5 Within an area of six (6) metres in every direction from the area in which Fireworks are sold or stored for the purposes of sale shall be designated and posted as a "non-smoking" area and no person may smoke or ignite any flammable material, or have in his possession any lighted match, lighter, pipe, cigar, cigarette, open flame or spark emitting device in such area;
- 5.6 No person shall sell Fireworks to any person under the age of eighteen years;
- 5.7 No vendor of Fireworks may permit any employee to sell Fireworks without first instructing such employee in the regulations of this By-law and ensuring that such employee complies with these regulations.
- 5.8 All vendors of Fireworks within the Township must hold a valid and appropriate license from the Explosives Branch of Natural Resources Canada, or its successors, if required.
- 5.9 All locations and buildings used for the sale of Fireworks must comply with the Township's Zoning By-law, as may be amended from time to time. This By-law shall be administered by the Chief Fire Official or their designate.

This By-law shall be enforced by a By-law Enforcement Officer.

6.0 Regulations Affecting the Sale of Family Fireworks

- 6.1 In addition to the regulations affecting the sale of Fireworks, no person shall sell Family Fireworks unless;
- a) the Fireworks are displayed for sale in lots that do not exceed twenty-five (25) kilograms each in gross weight;
 - b) the Fireworks are displayed in a place where they are not exposed to the rays of the sun or to excess heat or adjacent to any exit door; and
 - c) the Fireworks displayed in any shop window are mock samples only and do not

contain explosive composition.

- 6.2 No person shall sell Family Fireworks or possess Family Fireworks for the purpose of sale, except on Victoria Day, on Canada Day and on each of the seven (7) days immediately preceding Victoria Day and Canada Day.
- 6.3 All unsold Fireworks that exceed twenty-five (25) kilograms shall be returned to the manufacturer or distributor within seven (7) days immediately following Victoria Day and Canada Day; and
- 6.4 All remaining unsold Fireworks that do not exceed twenty-five (25) kilograms in gross weight shall be deemed in compliance with subsection 6.3 provided such Fireworks are immediately stored in a cool, dry place removed from flammable materials, and fuel fired appliances and are not accessible to the public.
- 6.5 The weight of Family Fireworks stored on site cannot exceed 1 ,000 kilograms in gross weight unless the vendor holds a valid and appropriate license to do so from the Explosives Branch of Natural Resources Canada, or its successors.

7.0 Regulations Affecting Mobile Sales of Fireworks

- 7.1 In addition to the regulations affecting the sale of Fireworks, no person shall sell Fireworks from a Mobile Sales Premise except in accordance with the following regulations:
 - a) that no fewer than two (2) signs are posted in prominent locations on the outside of the Mobile Sales Premise indicating that persons shall not smoke or ignite any flammable material, or have in their possession any lighted match, lighter, pipe, cigar, cigarette, open flame or spark emitting device within six (6) metres of the Mobile Sales Premise;
 - b) that the Mobile Sales Premise is not be located within twenty (20) metres of any road or occupied parking space and is not be located within forty (40) metres of any occupied building, or any dwelling or gas station and as otherwise regulated by the Explosives Branch of Natural Resources Canada, or its successors;
 - c) that the public shall not be permitted to enter any Mobile Sales Premise for the purpose or purchasing Fireworks unless there are at least two (2) operational doors providing means of access to and egress from the Mobile Sales Premise;
 - d) that no more than fifteen (15) customers are permitted in a Mobile Sales Premise at the same time;
 - e) that any portable power supply to the Mobile Sales Trailer is located not less than twelve (12) metres from the Mobile Sales Premises;
 - f) that, with the exception of its entrance and exit, every Mobile Sales Premise has a "no-encroachment zone: of at least six (6) metres established around its perimeter by means of a barrier, such as snow fencing or pylons or other material satisfactory to the Licensing Officer;
 - g) that such barrier will exclude the public from this area;
 - h) that every vendor of Fireworks from a Mobile Sales Premise provides and maintains fully operational fire extinguishing equipment, ready for immediate use, on site at all times; and
 - i) possess knowledge of the operating procedures of such fire extinguishing equipment and be capable of employing such fire extinguishing equipment.

8.0 Application, Renewal and Revocation of Permit

8.1 The Licensing Officer shall:

- a) co-ordinate the enforcement of this By-law;
- b) perform all the administrative functions conferred upon him by this By-law;
- c) make or cause to be made all investigations and inspections which he/she deems necessary to determine whether an applicant meets the requirements of this By-law and all applicable laws.

9.0 Obstruction

9.1 No person shall obstruct or hinder the entry of the inspection of a premise or Mobile Sales Premise by a Municipal Law Enforcement Officer, a Provincial Offences Officer, a Licensing Officer or a Peace Officer for the purposes of inspecting or for the enforcement of this By-law.

9.2 Every Person who has been alleged to have contravened any of the provisions of this by-law, shall identify themselves to the By-law Enforcement Officer, the Chief Fire Official or their designates upon request, failure to do so shall be deemed to have hindered or obstructed the By-law Enforcement Officer or Chief Fire Official under section 9.1 of this by-law.

9.3 The making of a false or intentionally misleading recital of fact, statement or representation in any agreement, statutory declaration or application form required by this By-law shall be deemed to be a violation of the provisions of this By-law and may result in the revocation of a permit issued hereunder.

9.4 Every person shall comply with the provisions of this By-law whether or not that person is licensed under this By-law.

9.5 Every vendor shall during the regular operating hours of the premises or Mobile Sales Premise and at all times when Fireworks are provided herein, make available for inspection by the Licensing Officer, a Peace Officer, a Provincial Offences Officer, or a Municipal By-law Enforcement Officer the original of any document or record referred to in this By-law.

9.6 Every permit applicant and every person discharging Fireworks shall, at all times during the set-up, discharge and dismantling of the Fireworks permit the entry by and the inspection of the site where the Fireworks will be discharged to a Municipal Law Enforcement Officer, a Provincial Offences Officer, a Licensing Officer or a Peace Officer.

10. Offence, Penalty and Enforcement

10.1 Every Person who contravenes any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offence and on conviction is liable to a fine as provided for in the Provincial Offences Act R.5.0. 1990, c. P.33.

10.2 Pursuant to the authority established in section 429 of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25 as amended, every Person who contravenes any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction pursuant to Part III of the Provincial Offences Act R.S.O. 1990, Chapter P.33, as amended, shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$10,000 for a first offence and to a fine of not more than \$50,000 for a subsequent offence.

10.3 The owner of the property shall be responsible for ensuring that this by-law is complied with. In the event the property is being rented, and the renter is not

in compliance, the owner of the property will be ultimately responsible.

11.0 Administrative Penalties

- 11.1 A By-law Enforcement Officer who finds that a Person has contravened any provision of this By-law may issue an administrative penalty notice addressed to that Person or owner where the contravention occurred.
- 11.2 The penalty notice shall be given to the Person to whom or to which it is addressed as soon as is reasonably practicable and shall include the following information:
- a) Particulars of the contravention, including to which property it applies;
 - b) The amount of the administrative penalty;
 - c) A statement advising that an administrative penalty will constitute a debt to the Municipality.
- 11.3 Any Person who contravenes any provision of this By-law shall, upon issuance of an administrative penalty notice pursuant to subsection 11.1, be liable to pay to the Municipality an administrative penalty as per By-law No. 122-2016 for the Recovery of Costs for Services Provided by the Alnwick/Haldimand Fire Rescue Department.
- 11.4 A Person who has been issued a penalty notice shall pay the administrative penalty within fifteen (15) days from the date the notice was issued.
- 11.5 An administrative penalty notice that is deemed to be confirmed constitutes a debt to the Municipality and may be added to the tax roll of the property on which the offence occurred.
- 11.6 The Township may serve any penalty notice, personally to the Person named on the notice, by registered or regular mail addressed to the Person to whom the document is to be given at the Person's last known place of abode.
- 11.7 Service by registered or regular mail under subsection 11.6 shall be deemed to have been made on the fifth day after the day of mailing.
- 11.8 A Person's last known address includes the address provided by the Person to the Township as identified in the property tax file.

12.0 Severability

- 12.1 If a Court of competent jurisdiction should declare any section or part of a section of this by-law to be invalid, such section or part of a section shall not be construed as having persuaded or influenced Council to pass the remainder of the by-law and it is hereby declared that the remainder of the by-law shall be valid and shall remain in force.

13.0 Township Not Liable

- 13.1 The Township assumes no liability for property damage or personal injury resulting from remedial action or remedial work undertaken with respect to any Person or property that is subject of this by-law.

14.0 Administration

- 14.1 This By-law shall be enforced by a Municipal Law Enforcement Officer, Licensing Officer employed by the Township, Chief Fire Official or their designate or by a Peace Officer or Provincial Offences Officer.

- 14.2 The Chief By-law Enforcement Officer, Chief Fire Official or their designate(s) may at any time, enter onto a property to determine whether this by-law is being complied with.
- 14.3 Every Person shall permit the Chief By-law Enforcement Officer, Chief Fire Official or their designate(s) to inspect any land for the purposes of determining compliance with this by-law.
- 14.4 The Chief By-law Enforcement Officer, Chief Fire Official or their designates may enter upon lands at any reasonable time to direct or require that a matter or thing be done, and in default of that matter or thing being done, to do such matter or thing in accordance with this by-law.
- 14.5 A Person exercising a power of entry on behalf of the Township under this by-law may be accompanied by any Person under their direction including Law Enforcement Services.


15.0 Short Title

- 15.1 This by-law shall be known as the "Fireworks By-law."


16.0 Miscellaneous

- 16.1 That By-law No. 81-2021 is hereby repealed in its entirety.
- 16.2 That this by-law shall become effective immediately upon passing thereof.

3. **"Theatrical Fireworks"** means an authorized explosive of a class set out in Section 6 of the *Explosives Act*, that is made, manufactured or used to produce pyrotechnic theatrical effect in connection with a motion picture, theatre or television production, or as a performance, before a live audience.
